SQUASH & CUCUMBERS

Black Beauty Zucchini - Glossy dark green zucchini on an open, bush type plant. Thin skin with creamy white flesh.

Raven Zucchini - Smooth skinned green-black fruits on a bush type plants. Relatively early, concentrated fruit production. Does well in all years.

Yellow Crookneck - Glossy thin-skinned yellow squash has fine textured flesh and a sweet, nutty flavor. Open bush plants with good mildew resistance.

Waltham Butternut - The benchmark for large butternuts, Waltham has a small seed cavity. Flesh has a smooth texture and sweet flavor. Good storage capacity. Vining plants need a trellis or space to roam.

Marketmore Cucumbers - Beautiful 6 - 8" dark green fruits are produced on 4 - 6' vines. Introduced in 1968, this is still a standard producing well under all weather conditions.

BASIL

Nufar - Italian large-leaf basil with leaves up to 4" long. Sweet scent and flavor. Resistant to Fusarium Wilt.

Newton - Italian large-leaf plants with classic basil flavor, but without the strong notes of anise. Fusarium resistant. Similar to Nufar, but later to flower.

Elidia - Genovese type basil with a compact habit. Slow to bolt. Excellent leaf shape and dark green color. Fusarium resistant.

Thai Basil - Classic Thai basil flavor with notes of anise-clove for use in Southeast Asian dishes.

GREENS

Toscano or "Dino" Kale - Long, narrow leaves are packed with classic kale flavor and nutrients.
